# Journey of an Old King from Serengeti

An old king from Serengeti is a symbolic name of lion also known as King of the Beasts, roamed widely in Serengeti National Park, Tanzania, Africa.

This exhibit demonstrate about an old lion sharing life long experience story whom regarded as a king in his pride in Serengeti to the new cub born in the zoo.

#### The Scope of the Exhibit

This story is about lions. The history of lion, physical characteristics of lion, habitats and social community of lion, threats to lion, contribution and influence of lion in human world, some aspect not directly related to lion as animal but it is still use lion as a term and the last is trial to protect the lion.

#### Treatment and Plan

The storyline is subdivided into 10 major sections and each subject is a continuance to the next. Each section is functionally of equal importance and every attempt was made to address that equality in their development. Some aspects were quite difficult to display in a thematic manner and more abstract methods were used to develop the story fully.

#### Thematic development

The lion is a well-known theme; this exhibit demonstrates a story approach as well as applying the material in a new way, utilizing the thematic information to its full extent. The most appropriate items are chosen, showing the connection between width and depth in the elaboration of the theme. Personal studies have resulted in new material being included.

#### Knowledge of subject

The exhibitor was born in August (and based on his zodiac sign, he is also a Leo). Since young, He has been fascinated about lion and read a lot of articles and books including surfing the internet on any articles related to lion, in trying to fully develop this story. Viewer will be exposed to many facts that are important to understand the subject. It has been quite challenging to find suitable elements and mix. It took more than 10 years trying to acquire all the material shown here in.

#### Philatelic importance

A wide range of philatelic material is shown. Priority is given to highest philatelic importance; world status rarity and high importance philatelic items (Original artworks, essays, proofs and varieties); important postal history items (covers and other postal documents), philatelic studies are included when appropriate, and are blended with thematic development.

#### Rarity

Uncommon items are shown besides other necessary important items that are more related in trying to find the elements that are suitable for the story line. There are some rare items on display, most notably is the original artist drawing stamp of the biggest denomination five Rupees, Uganda Protectorate, issued on 1896, shown on page 28. Other items include those original drawings, essays, dating back to the19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. All world status rarity and high importance rarity items were marked with BOLD OUTLINE on display. Degree of rarity Items are marked referring to their philatelic status and importance, based on records alternatively on own experience or knowledge with:

: Moderate importance rarity

We can open our jaws up to 65 degrees, it means that we can bite a chunk of meat that is big enough. The scissor like carnassials in the cheeks can shear through the flesh. The small teeth at the front of my mouth nip small pieces of meat off bones

The differently shaped teeth are designed for purposes like holding, killing, and cutting

Our teeth are well adapted for killing the preys and eating them. The great canine teeth are spaced in such a way that we can slip between the cervical vertebrae of their favorite-sized prey animals, and sever the spinal cord.



## 4.4 Threat to the king - Big game safari hunting

A safari is an overland journey. It usually refers to a trip to Africa, traditionally for a big-game hunt. People arrived from Europe with guns, and the killing of lions became much easier. In North Africa, lions were wiped out entirely ...



#### 4.4 Threat to the king - Situational predator

Although we are the top predator, it turns out that there are many other predators targeting us, especially our cubs. Even unexpectedly, animals are usually preyed by lions, become lions predator, like zebra and buffalo. They kill our cubs, in a way of butting, stepping the foot, kicking, etc. In other way, some other competition for food animals also became lions' predator by reason of minimizing the competition for food







From 1609 to 1797, the Republic of Venice required that all notaries, scribes, and public agents sending letters to government agencies had to pay 4 soldi per letter. The money went to the office of water commissioners to control tidal flooding. The sheets bore the letters AQ (Acque or waters) and the lion of St. Mark, the symbol of Venice. The numbered letter sheets were privately printed and distributed by a "daziere" or revenue officer. The AQ sheets were used as a wrapper enclosing the letter, or the message could be written directly on the sheet.

The AQ lettersheets are considered by many to be the world's first postal stationery. However, others consider the AQ lettersheets to be a type of revenue (fiscal) paper. Finally, some consider the AQ lettersheets to be semi-postal in nature, due to the use of the revenue for flood relief

When we visited Tuscany, my heart was beating wildly. This is the place where the lion was first captured as a stamp design. Lion of Tuscany is known throughout the world as the first postage stamp with lion design in the world. The stamps issued on 1851


#### 6.4 Learning the history from scientist - The descent of smilodon, related to the lion

From the previous learning, now I have a clear picture of the lion lineage and family ties with other cat family. These are listed in the following diagram.

The relationships and fossil history of the different cats are not fully understood.

In this diagram, the Cheetah (Guepard or Acinonyx jubatus) is separated from all the others and is called a running cat because it is unique in being able to chase its prey at great speed.

All other cats are called leaping cats, because they slowly stalk their prey and then leap on it

The term big cat - which is not a biological classification - is used informally to distinguish the larger cat species from smaller ones.

One definition of "big cat" includes the four members of the genus Panthera: the tiger, lion, leopard, and jaguar. Members of this genus are the only cats able to roar.

A more expansive definition of "big cat" also includes the cheetah, snow leopard, and cougar

# 6.4 Learning the history from scientist - Panthera leo, the modern lion

My subspecies is Panthera leo nubuca. Its sound very scientific. Yes, those scientists told me a lot about modern taxonomy introduced by Carolus Linnaeus. Carolus Linnaeus was a Swedish Botanist and Physician who laid the foundations for the modern scheme of taxonomy, what became known as the Linnaean taxonomy; the system of scientific classification now widely used in the biological sciences. The Linnaean system classified living things within a hierarchy

Lions are not native in China, they came to this country through the famous Silk Road



The lion dance dates back to the Han Dynasty and during the Tang Dynasty when it was at its peak

The lion dance is an important tradition in China, usually the dance is part of festivities like Chinese New Year, the openings of restaurants and weddings.

If well-performed, the lion dance is believed to bring luck and happiness.

#### 8.1 Government - Sher Ali Khan Emir of Kabul


Sher Ali Khan was born in Kabul 1823, he is son of Dost Mohammad Khan, Amir of Kabul (1826-1839, 1843-1863). Sher Ali Khan regulated Afghanistan as Amir of Kabul (1871 - 1878). The early postal history in Afghanistan is credited to Sher Ali Khan, who established a postal system in 1871 as part of a program modernization in the Kingdom of Kabul. The first stamp appeared in 1871. Early design stamp featured a tiger head / lion head symbolizing the name of Sher Ali

#### 8.2 Heraldry - Lion rampant

Lion rampant is the position most widely used in heraldry. A "lion rampant" is depicted in profile standing erect with forepaws raised. The position of the hind legs varies according to local custom: the lion may stand on both hind legs, braced wide apart, or on only one, with the other also raised to strike; the word rampant is often omitted, especially in early blazon, as this is the most usual position of a carnivorous quadruped; the term segreant denotes the same position, but is only used in reference to griffins and dragons

#### 8.2 Heraldry - Lion rampant

Other terms are used to describe the lion's position in further detail. It should be noted that each coat of arms has a right and left (i.e. dexter and sinister) side - with respect to the person carrying the shield - so the left side of the shield as drawn on the page (thus the right side to the shield bearer) is called the dexter side. The lion's head is normally seen in agreement with the overall position, facing dexter (left) unless otherwise stated

#### 8.2 Heraldry - Stamp design

Since medieval times, the lion has become an animal that is most widely used as the coat of arms. With the start of early usage of postage stamp in the world of postal system, many countries have been issuing stamps and stationeries with the design of lion in coat of arm and many other forms of lion designs. 

## 8.2 Heraldry - Bohemian lion

The double-tailed silver Bohemian lion represent of Czechoslovakia. The design is greatly influenced by Austrian heraldry since the country used to be a part of the Habsburg monarchy, and by German heraldry, but also shows Hungarian and Slavic influences. 



World Wildlife Fund (WWF) founded in Switzerland, 1961 and is working on issues regarding the conservation, research and restoration of the environment In 1986, WWF realized that its old name no longer reflected the scope of its activities The name was changed into World Wide Fund for Nature, retaining the WWF initials The United States and Canada, however, retained the full old name, World Wildlife Fund for Animals



#### 10.3 Global campaign endangered species

An endangered (EN) species is one which has been categorized by the International Union for Conservation of Nature as likely to become extinct. Conservation biologists use the IUCN Red List, where "endangered" is the second most severe conservation status for wild populations, following critically endangered

Many nations have laws that protect conservation reliant species, for example, forbidding hunting, restricting land development, or creating preserves

The IUCN Red List of Threatened Species (also known as the "IUCN Red List" and "Red Data List"), created in 1963, is the world's most comprehensive inventory of the global conservation status of plant and animal species.
